STOMACH SURGERY NOT REVOLUTIONIZED

SYRACUSE, N. Y., Nov. 24.—"There is no revolution dawning in surgery of the stomach. The medical profession is advancing step by step, but no great leap forward has been taken because of the discovery of any single surgical method."

This is the comment made today by Dr. John Van Duyn, veteran Syracuse surgeon and oldest faculty member of the College of Medicine, Syracuse University, to Dr. H. B. Devine, of Melbourne, Australia.

Dr. Devine declared before the American College of Surgeons in New York City that a system of rendering diseased portions of the stomach nerveless and allowing them to remain in the human body would obviate the necessity of dangerous operations.

"Diseased parts of the human stomach may be treated in such a way as to be safely left intact, as Dr. Devine asserts. Anything is possible, I suppose. I am afraid however, there are not many surgeons who will advocate such a disposition of gastric disturbances," Dr. Van Duyn said.

"It is much better to remove the 'bad' tissue of the food cavity even though the operation is of a highly complicated nature. Once the infected area of the stomach wall is taken out the patient may be reasonably sure he is relieved of his troubles."

CALL CONFERENCE TO CUT TERRIBLE AUTO DEATH TOLL

WASHINGTON, Nov. 25.—In an effort to decrease the appalling loss of life in traffic accidents, Secretary of Commerce Hoover has called a national conference on street and highway casualties, to meet in Washington December 15, 16 and 17.

Official statistics show that in 1923, 22,600 persons were killed.

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\$78,000 injured, and more than \$900,000,000 worth of property damage caused by traffic mishaps. Estimates indicate that 1924 will show even a more terrible casualty list from this source, and government officials deem it high time to take steps to make the highways of the nation less hazardous.

A number of committees of the National Anti-Accident Organization have held frequent meetings during the past few months and have drafted reports to be submitted to the national conference.

"The request for a national gathering for the purpose of better organization and co-ordination of activities in the reduction of accidents was proposed to me six months ago by a number of national associations interested in this field," Secretary Hoover said.

"In order that a national conference on the subject might function to definite purpose, I appointed eight special committees on different important phases of the problem, the representatives being chosen from all parts of the country and embracing representatives of the police officials, highway and motor vehicle commissioners, insurance companies, safety councils, chambers of commerce, labor unions, automobile associations and various other national groups.

"These committees have a membership of 186 persons and cover the subjects of statistics, traffic control, construction and engineering, city planning and zoning, insurance, education, motor vehicles and public relations."

Reports of the committees will soon be ready for submission. They represent the most exhaustive attempt yet made to get at the causes and remedy for accidents, according to Hoover.

Officially pointed out that should the death rate during the next seven years increase as during the last similar period the annual loss of life would approach the total number of American soldiers killed during the World War. The number of injured is already almost equal to that of the American war-wounded.

Test Tensile Strength of Limestone Beams WASHINGTON, Nov. 25.—Fatigue tests for eighteen heavy limestone beams, testing their durability and resistance against heavy loads, are in progress at the United States Bureau of Standards.

For more than sixteen months the beams, twenty-eight inches between supports, four inches wide and one and one-half inches thick, have been subjected to a load equal to two-thirds of that required to break them.

None of the beams has broken but the average bending is .002 inches.
