H. Walker, city engineer, who has been handling the finishing up of the big project since it was turned over as completed by the contractors in charge of construction.

It has been necessary to allow much of the water which has already been backed up by the dam, to run out, since it was deemed unwise to store the water so soon after the completion of the dam.
