99,503 PATENTS ASKED IN YEAR BY U S INVENTORS

WASHINGTON, Dec. 2.—American inventors contributed \$3,042,276 to the coffers of the Federal Patent Office, the largest sum ever received in any single year, according to the annual report of Commissioner Thomas E. Robertson, submitted to the Secretary of the Interior today. This increase was made notwithstanding a slight decrease in the number of applications for patents, designs and trademarks, from 100,724 for the preceding year to 99,503 for the last fiscal year.

The great activity in the Patent Office is shown in the reduction in the amount of work awaiting official action, the report pointed out. There are now on hand 12,000 fewer patent cases than there were a year ago, 2,469 fewer design cases and 1,850 fewer trade mark cases, showing a decrease in the work on hand of over 16,000 cases for the year. The report calls attention to the fact that a committee, which will make a thorough study of Patent Office procedure, will be composed of representatives nominated by the American Bar Association, the United States Chamber of Commerce, the National Association of Patent Lawyers and the Patent Law Associations of Chicago, Cleveland, Detroit, Pittsburgh and New York. Every facility and opportunity will be offered this committee to make an entirely independent study of Patent Office procedure.

Attention is also called in the report to the fact that unregistered attorneys and attorneys who have been disbarred for gross misconduct are practicing in at least eight widely scattered cities. These unregistered attorneys impose upon inventors, who would not entrust their secrets to them if they knew they were not registered. These unregistered attorneys have also been practicing under fictitious names and under the names of companies and corporations. Representative Cramton, of Michigan has introduced a bill in Congress which will permit the United States courts to prevent this fraudulent practice. Commissioner of Patents Robertson urgently recommended in his report that this bill be enacted into law.
