## UNCLE SAM HAS NOT FORGOTTEN OLD SHIP

PORTLAND, Dec. 8. — The navy department has not forgotten the old battleship Oregon, but it has not yet been able to spend enough money to place her in condition for delivery to the state of Oregon, according to the annual report of Admiral E. W. Eberle, chief of naval operations. The report says: "The state of Oregon has passed a bill appropriating funds for the upkeep of the battleship Oregon, and the navy department has stated its willingness to turn over the battleship to the state for retention as a relic. "The department has not so far been able to authorize the expenditure of funds to effect all the repairs that are asked by the state prior to the acceptance of the ship."

## KING GEORGE SAYS ACTION WAS RIGHT

LONDON, Dec. 9. — A defense of the action of the British government in Egypt, following the assassination of Sir Lee Stack was made here today by King George V in his speech opening parliament. Though streets gay with flags, the King and Queen drove through lines of guardsmen to their destination. The drive was without unusual incident, although special search was made for fear of a demonstration by disgruntled Egyptian radicals.

## LAST MINUTE MOVE FAILS TO STOP BILL

WASHINGTON, Dec. 9. — The interior department appropriation bill, carrying \$238,000,000 was passed today by the House. A last minute effort to amend the bill, calling for the abolition of 39 land offices all over the country, was defeated on a motion of Representative Sinnott of Oregon. The bill was passed, provides for the continuation of land offices at La Grande and Burns, as well as several in Washington and Idaho.

## MAN ASKS POLICE TO STOP HIS DRIVING

PORTLAND, Dec. 9. — The strangest case on the record of the police station occurred here today when Robert Poole, walk-

ed into headquarters, deposited his automobile driver's license, and asked that he never be allowed to drive a car in Oregon again. He admitted he drank and said that it was unfair for him to endanger the lives of others.
