in Coos county, where agents from the state prohibition department have furnished the evidence for something like seventyfive prohibition cases this year, and where the cooperation of the local officers and courts are harmonious, we have been able to secure several heavy fines for moonshining, and the best part of it is that over 95 per cent of the cases in that county are pleading guilty in the Justice Court. saving the expense of jury trials




