JUDGES IN OREGON GIVING BIG FINES FOR BOOTLEGGERS A very large number of judges in Oregon are beginning to realize the absolute necessity of fully cooperating in the enforcement of the prohibition laws of the state by giving adequate sentence to the offender who has been convicted or has pleaded guilty. Nothing will stop moonshining or bootlegging as quickly as the giving of the maximum sentence in every case especially all offenders.

Judge C. M. Thomas of Jackson county, recently sentenced C. A. Cobb who entered a plea of guilty of possessing a still, to serve two years in the state penitentiary.

Maximum penalty of one year in jail and payment of a fine of \$1000 was imposed by District Judge Dickson of Multnomah county, on Frank Hantcock, said to be an old offender at the moonshining game, and convicted again on a charge of possession of a still.

In Coos county, where agents from the state prohibition department have furnished the evidence for something like seventy-five prohibition cases this year, and where the cooperation of the local officers and courts are harmonious, we have been able to secure several heavy fines for moonshining, and the best part of it is that over 95 per cent of the cases in that county are pleading guilty in the Justice Court, saving the expense of jury trials and exasperating continuances.

Justice of the Peace Joehnk, of Marshfield, sentenced J. C. Bryant for manufacturing liquor, a thousand dollars and gave him thirty days in jail. He also sentenced Nels Jesterson for possession of a still, \$2000 and thirty days in jail, and Circuit Judge Kendall sentenced Emil Johnson to pay a \$2000 fine and serve ninety days in jail.

In Yamhill county, we also have had splendid success in the Justice Court. Justice of the Peace Rogers of McMinnville sentenced Wm. Oldenberg to pay a \$1000 fine and serve one hundred fifty days in jail, and John Berkich for possession of a still, to pay \$3000 and serve one hundred thirty days in jail.

In Clackamas county, where we have a very vigorous justice of the peace in E. J. Noble, there has been assessed one \$3000 fine and one year in jail, one \$1,250 fine and six months in jail, and two thousand dollars fine and six months each for moonshining, and one persistent offender is awaiting trial under \$5000 bond.

In Multnomah county we have been having very good success also. Albert Quartier, charged with possession of a still, was tried before Circuit Judge Duffy, fine \$1500 and given one hundred

eighty days in jail, and Charles Zidell of Portland, was tried before District Judge Dickson and fined \$1000 and given a year in jail for selling a still to state agents.

In Tillamook county Circuit Judge Bagley gave the following sentences for violation of the prohibition laws: Jack Levinhaven, moonshiner, fined \$2,750 and one year in jail; Fred Sheenthaler, moonshiner, fined \$3000 and one year in jail; Roy Pilkington, moonshiner, fined \$3000 and one year in jail.

A great many other cases could be enumerated. Let public sentiment back the faithful judges who are thus cooperating in the enforcement of the prohibition laws and let public sentiment demand from the other judges who are more lenient in pronouncing sentences to stiffen up a bit.
