## MENTAL EXERCISES TO PROLONG LIFE

CHICAGO, Dec. 10. — A debutante can dance straight through for nineteen hours. A business man isn't tired after a fourteen-hour day.

"And, besides that," Frederick Pierce, international known analytical psychologist, told the Executives' Club of Chicago. "you don't worry, and you feel better than you ever did."

He told them how to increase their working hours and still not shorten their lives, by taking an exercise known as the De Cubitas exercise. According to Mr. Pierce the workout is entirely mental. "The exercise is based on the complete relaxation of the automatic, or unconscious, brain center, which occupies three-fourths of the entire mentality and consists of the nervous system controlling muscles, glands and all other organs," he told them.

The attention is centered on a special set of muscles. Hold an arm at right angles, then shift the attention to another set of muscles. The first arm then drops automatically to your side, in a state of complete and unconscious relaxation. The whole body is rested in this manner," concluded the speaker.

Mr. Pierce says this is an un-falling rest exercise for all who find they do not enjoy a sufficient number of walking "peppy" hours.
