NEW MINES FOUND IN CRIPPLE CREEK, LONG SLUMBERING

DENVER, Dec. 16.—With new capital pouring into development work in the Colorado hills that have produced many millions in valuable ores, and hundreds of prospectors trekking through abandoned tunnels, the mining industry in Colorado is staging a notable "come-back."
 A recent extensive survey of the mining activities of the State disclosed that forty-two metals are produced in Colorado on a commercial basis. They range from arsenic, which brings fifteen cents a pound, to radium, with the enormous value of \$120,000 per gram.

New strikes of rich ore have been reported from many former wealth-producing camps; but it remained for Cripple Creek, maker of many millionaires, to unearth one of the richest mineral veins in the history of the State's mining operations.
 After a period of ten years' depression, during which it was believed all the "golden cream" had been skimmed from the earth around this famous old mining camp, Cripple Creek reported the discovery of a rich deposit of the rarest and most valuable of minerals—tellurite.
 The discovery, which is thrilling the mining world, was made in the State's deepest shaft—at the 3,000-foot level—and already several carloads of the mineral have been shipped to smelters.
 Tellurite is a new member of the tellurium element, of which sylvanite and calaverite, also are members. Unlike the latter, however, which are found in a flaky substance, the new discovery—tellurite—has been found in solid cubes and, according to Cripple Creek reports, assays as high as \$139,000 per ton. The new gold tellurite promises to put Cripple Creek again in the front rank among the gold-producing camps of the world.

Elks Just the Same the World Over

PARIS, Dec. 15.—East is East and West is West, but Elks are all the same, according to Professor Schmidt, of Copenhagen, who, in lecturing before the Academy of Science, said the European eel and the American eel go to the same spot to reproduce. This spot, says Professor Schmidt, is northwest of the Antilles, between the 48th and 60th degrees of longitude, in the middle of the Atlantic Ocean.

Years of close study of the eel has convinced the professor that it takes the average eel three years to make the journey from the hatching grounds to the American or European shores, and that a European eel may continue on its voyage, crossing to America or vice versa.

DARROW DEBATES DEATH PUNISHMENT

ST. LOUIS, Dec. 16.—Judges lawyers and laymen are interested in the debate scheduled for the Odeon, between Clarence Darrow, famous criminal lawyer, of Chicago, who defended Nathan Leopold, Jr., and Richard Loeb, and Lawrence McDaniel, former Circuit Attorney of St. Louis.
 The subject of capital punishment will be discussed, Mr. Darrow assailing it and Mr. McDaniel defending its use in major criminal offenses.
 Mr. McDaniel was instrumental in obtaining the enactment of the bill that restored capital punishment in Missouri. Mr. Darrow has been for many years an outstanding opponent of the system and has led the forces throughout the country seeking to eliminate legal executions.
