PARIS, Dec. 18. — Feminine lingerie is growing lighter and lighter every day. With the silhouette getting more and more slender, things that go under the frock must follow suit.

Softest silks and crepes are taking the place of fine linen and mousseline that had the preference last year. Colored silks are in order; even the underwear must be bright. Gay green and bright yellow are very popular, and always the full range of pinks and roses.

Lace, once almost taboo, has returned with a rush. The finer varieties, such as Binche, Chantilly and tulle, are the most used. Embroidered tulle is very effective, done in old ochre in a rustic design of different thicknesses. It is used in wide bands, often double, on chemises and nightgowns. The latest movement is to trim colored silk lingerie with ochre lace, or even with black. One of the specialty shops has a primrose pink silk voile, trimmed with three-inch bands of ochre Binche about the top of the chemise, and another set in green, has black lace. Valenciennes is still the aristocrat of laces. A charming apricot-colored silk voile is cut deep at the back, with ribbon shoulder-straps to hold it in place, and bordered above and below with delicate Valenciennes, in deep cream color.

"LAKE ELIZABETH"

Editor Daily Tidings:—

We are taught in the Bible to ask great things of God. Even the "importunate widow's" request was granted "by her much asking" and I do not know where or to whom to go so will send my petition to the proper person through your paper, hoping it will gain attention.

My petition is that at the closing of the gates of the Emigrant Creek dam, that the water of the lake that is to be formed will be christened by the proper parties "Lake Elizabeth" for my mother, she being the first white woman to settle in the upper Rogue River Valley and the land which the lake is supposed to partly cover was owned by her after my father's death. Later she sold this land to Mr. Kingsburg.

Seventy-two years ago (1851) Elizabeth Hill and family were busy in their Tennessee home (not getting Christmas presents ready, but getting ready to leave friends and home and cherished belongings to cross the plains to Oregon Territory, that little red spot on the corner of the map away off on the Pacific Coast on the edge of the Indian Territory which reached to the Missouri river and was inhabited only by Indians). My mother listened to father's directions of needs on the plains where nothing could be obtained after we left the Missouri River until we crossed the mountains in Oregon Territory. (He had crossed in '49 and re-crossed in '51) and therefore knew our wants must meet the capacity of five wagons carrying supplies and provisions for at least six months time.)

I would be glad to give you a pen picture of all my mother experienced but your paper is not

big enough to tell half, but I hope there are readers of the Tidings who think my mother's name should live by honoring the memory of her pioneer life. She and my father, Isaac Hill are both sleeping on the hill overlooking their Donation claim of 1853 where they helped to bury seven Indian war friends and neighbors, and whose children and friends recently improved the grounds to perpetuate the name of "Hill cemetery" and preserve it from being cast out in the commons. To all these helpers from seven different states, the writer wishes to extend heart felt thanks; and to you who have the authority to name the lake, I extend to you in advance a thanks. God bless you and I wish you well. —MRS. ANN H. HILL RUSSELL

Canada Will Sell Wood Pulp Lands

WINNIPEG, Man., Dec. 18.—

Forty thousand square miles of pulp-wood land in Manitoba will be sold to the highest bidder by the Federal Department of Lands to encourage the development of the paper and pulp industry in Western Canada, according to an official announcement here.

The timber limits, which run along the east side of Lake Winnipeg, constitute practically all the pulp wood in the province. Under the terms of the sale, it is announced, the purchaser will be required to erect, within one year a pulp and paper mill costing not less than \$2,000,000, with a daily capacity of 100 tons of newsprint

paper. The purchaser will be entitled to cut 3,000,000 cords of spruce pulp wood.
