BRITISH TO KEEP TROOPS ON RHINE IF FRENCH STAY

According to the Treaty of Versailles, the military occupation of Germany should end in January, 1925, provided that Germany has satisfied the demands made on her in regard to both reparations and disarmament. The acceptance of the Dawes plan has settled the first condition. The second depends on the report of the Inter-Allied Commission, which, after long inquiry, is to report to the Council of Ambassadors in Paris.

It is pretty generally believed that the French and Belgian delegates on the Commission will report against Germany. The British representatives are expected to report that on the whole, the Germans have fairly satisfied the requirements of the Treaty in regard to disarmament. But this difference of opinion can only result in the continued occupation of Germany by the Allied forces.

What line of action will the British Cabinet then take? It probably will be decided by the fact that, although the British troops occupy Cologne and the adjacent area, they only do so as part of the combined armies of occupation. This means that if the British forces drew out immediately, they would be at once, and automatically, replaced either by French or Belgians.

This would have several effects. It would be totally against the wishes of the inhabitants: it would convert the Ruhr into a kind of French island; and it
