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50,000-Acre Preserve for Hunting Club

CHICAGO, Dec. 31. —Game birds of many species bred on the 50,000-acre hunting preserve of the Pacific Coast Sportsmen's Club, in California, will be used to stock wild coverts in every State in the Union, according to announcement here by Frederick L. Sims, chairman of the board of organization.

"The preserve will breed 250,000 wild fowl annually," said Mr. Sims. "The variety will be ring-neck pheasant, quail, wild turkey, Hungarian partridge, oscilla-

ted wild turkey of Central America, prairie chicken and the tinamou of South America. Ten per cent of all the fowl raised will be distributed through national societies."
