If served by publication, then within SIX WEEKS from the date of the first publication of this summons.

If you fail to answer in said cause within the time as above specified, the Plaintiff will apply to the Court for the relief demanded in said complaint, to-wit: That the title to a parcel of land situated in the City of Ashland, Jackson County, State of Oregon, being all that part of Lot 3, Block 4, of the present plat of the City of Ashland, lying south of High Street and more particularly described as follows, to-wit: Beginning at the intersection of the south line of High Street with the westerly side line of Granite Street in the City of Ashland, Jackson County, Oregon; Thence extending northwesterly along the southerly side line of High Street 206 feet, more or less, to the easterly side line of alley; Thence southwesterly along the easterly side line of said alley 105 feet, more or less, to an intersection with the northerly side line of Lot number 1, of Block number 39, per the recorded plat thereof adopted by the Common Council of the City of Ashland, November 5, 1888; Thence south 68 degrees east along the northerly side line of said lot one, 264 feet, more or less, to the westerly side line of Granite Street; Thence north 21 degrees east along the said westerly line of Granite Street, 16 feet, more or less, to the place of beginning; Be quieted in the Plaintiff, Irving F. Editor Tidings:— I understand that our City Council has received a communication from the city of Gold Hill suggesting cooperation between the two cities in enforcing the traffic laws. I happened to be in the car driven by a member of our council last summer while passing through Gold Hill. In a part of the city that was no more thickly settled than the average country road and where the highway was perfectly straight and unobstructed and no car or other vehicle in sight, he exceeded the speed limit by perhaps four or five miles per hour. He was not endangering anyone, and in fact did not realize he was still inside the city limits, there was so little resembling a city before us, and yet he was picked up by their special officer and fined for exceeding the speed limit. I would suggest that our Council inform the Hon. Mayor and Council of Gold Hill that if their idea of enforcing the traffic laws consists in catching any one they can in a technical violation of the law without regard to whether anyone is being endangered and with a "rule of reason," we are not in sympathy with them. Breaks World's Record for Rolling Cigars

MANCHESTER, N. H. Jan. 5. —What is believed to be a new world's cigarmaking record has been established at the R. G. Sullivan factory by Oscar Van Wymersch, who rolled some 4,500 cigars in a week. As yet no other cigarmaker can be found who ever rolled that number in forty-eight hours, the average cigarmaker rolling about 2,000.

In setting the new record, Van Wymersch bettered the factory's day-production record when he rolled 784 cigars. The previous record of 764 was held by Robert Wills, another speedy cigarmaker at the factory.
