

A contest over the will of the late Samuel Gompers, president of the American Federation of Labor was today filed by his widow, Mrs. Gertrude Gompers, 41, who married the labor leader three years before his death. The estate is valued at \$30,000. Mrs. Gompers alleges that the second will, executed a few weeks before her husband's death, and by which she was cut off without her dower rights, was due to "fraud, and undue influence" exercised by Samuel J. Gompers, her step son.
