UNDERWOOD BILL ON POWER PLANT PASSED

WASHINGTON, Jan. 8.—The Senate today passed the Underwood bill, authorizing President Coolidge to lease Muscle Shoals, the \$150,000,000 nitrate and power plant to the highest bidder by next September. The lease cannot run longer than 50 years. If the lease cannot be consummated, a federal corporation would be organized to operate, the properties. The vote was 48-37.

PARK CAMP GROUND REPORT IS MADE

A total of 135 automobiles, carrying 415 passengers registered at the camp grounds in Lithia Park during December, according to an announcement made today by Frank Jordan, park superintendent.

This total is an exceptionally fine showing for December, considered one of the slowest months of the year, and shows that the tourist traffic is starting to be a year round proposition for Ashland, and for Oregon.

MAIL LOST WHEN CAR DIVES INTO WATER

SEATTLE, Jan. 9.—The day's mail for the towns of Issaquah, Preston and North Bend was lost today when a mail truck, waiting for the ferry to Madison Park plunged from the wart into thirty feet of water. George Stratton, the driver of the truck had alighted but a few minutes before the accident. The truck started down the hill when the brakes slipped.

SPLENDID HARBOR RISING FROM RUINS

YOKOHAMA, Japan, Jan. 9.—The earthquake and fire which destroyed the city of Yokohama more than a year ago has proved a blessing in disguise. Out of the ashes of the ruined seaport is arising the finest harbor in the Far East.

Reconstruction work on a gigantic scale is proceeding all along the Yokohama waterfront. Eight piers already have been reconstructed and five others will be finished by the first of March.

Destruction of the old piers has made it possible to rebuild the port on a much larger scale and to install equipment in keeping with the needs of modern shipping. Despite the tremendous loss entailed through the earthquake and fire, it is estimated that a sum equal to the entire loss from the disaster would have been necessary to carry out the work of modernizing and increasing the facilities of the harbor.

Practically every pier that has been reconstructed has been enlarged. Dredging operations have deepened the waterways of the harbor so that it is possible to accommodate larger ships than ever before.

Although much has been accomplished in the way of rebuilding, reconstruction work has barely commenced. The plans of the harbor authorities contemplate an active building program that will not be completed until 1930. When these plans are finished, however, it is declared that Yokohama will be one of the finest and best equipped seaports in the world.

KID MCCOY GIVEN A STIFF SENTENCE

LOS ANGELES, Jan. 8. — Kid McCoy was today sentenced to one to ten years in San Quentin prison as the result of his being found guilty of manslaughter in connection with the murder of his sweetheart, Mrs. Teresa Mors. Judge Crail sentenced McCoy after denying his release on bail pending the determination of his appeal for a new trial. "This is a shock," McCoy exclaimed as he was sentenced. He appeared pale and weak as he walked from the court room to his cell.

"Stampeders" Are Ordered Held Up

KETCHIKAN, Alaska, Jan. 6. — "Stampeders" traveling by automobiles, dog teams and afoot to the Gaslar placer district strike, British Columbia, have stopped on the international boundary line northeast of Wrangell, Alaska, by the Royal Canadian Mounted Police and refused to travel to the scene of operation by way of Stikine, Telegraph Creek and the Dease Lake trail until March, according to the word received here.

The order to head off the Winter rush was issued to prevent hardship and privation without proper provisions at Cassiar.

Gossips Land Her Husband in Jail

NEWARK, N. J., Jan. 6.—Mrs. Carrie Bates of Newark, confined to a woman neighbor that her husband was wanted by the police of Virginia. The police learned of it and had Bates put in jail.

For three days Mrs. Bates pleaded for his release, but police learned from Newport News that Bates has been wanted in connection with a bootleg case.

Reindeer More Than Pay for Alaska Buy

WASHINGTON, Jan. 9. — Domesticated reindeer herds in Alaska are now worth \$1,550,000 more than the United States paid to Russia in 1867 for the entire territory, the Bureau of Education announced in its annual report to the Secretary of the Interior.

Natives own the majority of the reindeer, which supply them with food, clothing and a livelihood. The industry has developed since 1892, when the bureau began to import the animals from Siberia.

Plans are under way now, the bureau report said, to establish cooperative marketing, so that reindeer products from the herds which are scattered throughout Alaska may be transported to market. The general consumption of reindeer meat throughout this country depends only on adequate transportation facilities, it was said.

British Golfers Spend Fortunes on the Links

LONDON, Jan. 6. — Britain's one million golfers spend \$250,000,000 annually on the ancient Scottish game it has been estimated.

Golfers spend \$40,000,000 annually in fees and club dues and \$30,000,000 more for golf balls and other supplies.

Caddies, railway and motor-car traveling, special golfing clothes, instructional fees and prizes cost the enormous sum of \$180,000,000 annually, it is figured.

Birmingham Laughs Last and It's Quite a Cackle

BIRMINGHAM, Mich., Jan. 6. —The village of Birmingham believes it is having the last laugh in its struggles with Lakeview, a suburb, to induce the community to accept annexation to Birmingham. The suburb recently voted down an annexation proposition, although Birmingham for some time has sought to bring about such a step.

Now the Birmingham village commission has voted to cut off the Lakeview water supply next Spring unless the suburb petitions for and votes favorably upon another annexation proposal by next April. Lakeview has been supplied with water by the village.

Globe-Trotter of 17 Inherits Earldom

LONDON, Jan. 9. — From a poky little cabin aboard a tramp steamer to the luxury of a Jacobean mansion was the quick change of circumstances experienced recently by the seventeen-year-old Earl of Suffolk.

The Earl had been knocking around the world in the steamer Mount Steward, sharing the hard life and food of sailors, for about eighteen months, when the death of the old Earl was announced.

ABERDEEN, Miss., Jan. 9. — There will be a shortage of hogs in this section of the State, according to livestock experts, this season, but not in the family of John F. Plant.
