Senator George W. Norris, of Nebraska, has introduced into the Senate a resolution directing that the Federal Trade Commission investigate an alleged "power trust," said to be making efforts to influence a decision by Congress in the Muscle Shoals fight. He has been active in his opposition to Senator Underwood's plan to have the Government lease Muscle Shoals for private operation. Word has come from Vienna that King Boris, of Bulgaria, and Princess Ileana, youngest daughter of King Ferdinand and Queen Marie of Romania, are to be betrothed. Premier Alexander Zarkoff, of Bulgaria, is said to be in Belgrade seeking support for the proposed royal marriage. A. V. Rosell, direct descendant of one of the Emperors of the Incas, will lead an expedition organized to search for the fabulous wealth of the ancient Indian prince in Peru. The expedition, in which Senator Elect Hiram Bingham, of Connecticut, is said to be interested, is being organized in New York. In a speech urging the Senate not to adjourn without voicing vigorous protest against the apparent intention of the French Government to repudiate its war debt to the United States, Senator David A. Reed, of Pennsylvania, warned France "not to chill the affection of this country" by any ill-advised action. Americans have been taxed \$500,000,000 during the past five years to pay interest which the French nation has failed to pay, he said.

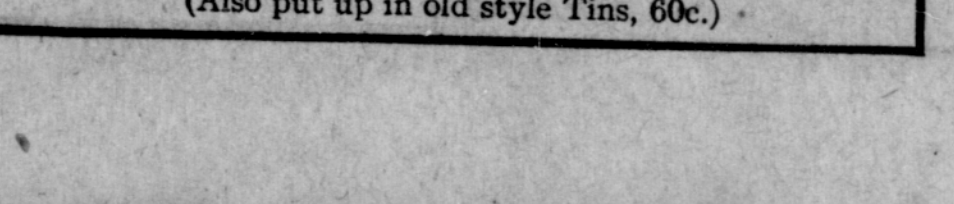
