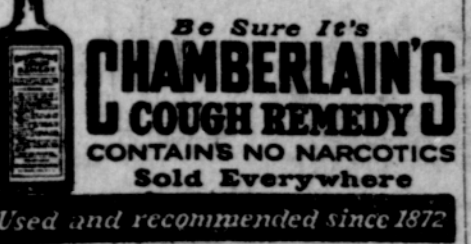

**LOYD GEORGE IS AGAIN A FACTOR**

LONDON, Jan. 13. — David Lloyd George, for more than two years under a shadow in the House of Commons, is coming back to the undisputed pre-eminence that he enjoyed in that assembly while Premier.

Although leader of only a tiny band of forty Liberals — out of a House of 615 members — today he is like the Lloyd George of twenty years ago. His post-war weariness seems entirely to have disappeared. Once more he is the old-time gladiator. Confident, gliding in battle, he is again the ruthless debater of his prime, dealing out blows of terrific force, whatever be the forces against him.

Lloyd George is always at his best in attack. His youthful audacity made his reputation. And today he realizes that he and his party must attack or go under. The undisputed leader of his forces, no longer having to play second fiddle to Herbert Asquith, he accordingly seeks the fray at all times and seems to enjoy every moment of it. From his modest seat on one of the back benches he addresses the Commons with all the authority that once he used as virtual dictator of Britain. And few men care to risk a tussle with him.

His power was swiftly evident on the first day of the present session. He arose to speak on the question of war debts. A few younger members, both on the Conservative and Labor sides, tried to interrupt him even to jeer at him. When he had finished with them, just two minutes later, they looked as if they would try any route in order to creep away unseen. Lloyd George had the ascendancy once more.

What his future will be no man can fortell. At present it can only be said that he is the dominant personality of the House of Commons, and mere members count little against his arresting personality. From the normal viewpoint, seeing the present fortunes of his party, and the persistent increasing Labor strength, one would say that there is little likelihood of Lloyd George ever holding high office again.

But the British politics is kaleidoscopic. Nothing today can be regarded as fixed and unmovable.

This prediction is made by the Sears-Roebuck Agricultural Foundation here, in a survey of the relative volume of agricultural exports for a number of years.

Agricultural exports from the United States show a marked decrease for 1924. The first half of this year records a volume a little below the level of exports just preceding the World War.

**COUNTERFEITING IS LOST ART IN U S**

PHILADELPHIA, Jan. 13. —Counterfeiting is now almost a lost art, declared Captain William H. Houghton, chief of the U. S. Secret Service here, commenting upon the scarcity of "queer" money being pushed across store counters during the Christmas holiday rush. Only two complaints were made, he stated, and they concerned counterfeit notes for small amounts.

Captain Houghton said the absence of well-known counterfeiters and money-raisers was due to the scarcity of spurious coin this holiday. Hundreds of complaints to the Secret Service Bureau were reported in former years, he said. The absence of money-raisers, he said, was due to their presence in various Federal penitentiaries.
