Negotiations for the funding of the \$4,000,000,000 French war debt to the United States have been begun between Secretary of the Treasury Andrew W. Mellon and Etienne Clementel, French Minister of Finance. A note sent to Mellon suggests a ten-year moratorium and states what the French Government believes France will be able to do in the nature of payments. Payments after the moratorium, it is understood, would cover a period of eighty years, with interest at one and one-half per cent.
