

CRIME IN SICILY SPREADING FAST

ROME, Jan. 19. - Crime in Sicily has of late assumed alarming proportions.

Murders of individuals have been most frequent, but even these have been put in the shade by the number of crimes against whole families.

One of the most startling of these latter was recently enacted at Santa Maria, a small market town near Palermo, which resulted in eight members of three families being killed and injured.

The members of three families nineteen in all, were assembled in a garden in the town when rifle fire was opened upon them by several men concealed outside. Fortunately the trees and shrubs afforded the intended victims some protection, but several fell and the remainder escaped to the adjoining house, where arming themselves, they opened fire on the attackers who decamped, leaving behind a note declaring that a massacre of the three families would undoubtedly be carried out in the near future.
