JAPANESE DEMAND CURB ON POWER OF HOUSE OF PEERS

TOKYO, Jan. 20.—Reform of the Japanese House of Peers is the burning political issue in the Land of the Rising Sun at present.

If the government of Premier Kato falls within the next few months the issue which will cause its downfall will be the question of curbing the power and changing the make-up of the upper house of the Japanese legislature. Keen observers of domestic politics predict that the Kato government will be unable to weather the storm which is expected to break when the question comes before the Imperial Diet.

Unlike England, where the House of Lords long ago was shorn of any real power, the House of Peers is a potent factor in Japanese governmental affairs. It has much to say about enactment of legislation and the promulgation of Government policies.

Under the present system all members of the Imperial family are automatically members of the House of Peers. Noblemen holding the rank of Prince, Count or Marquis also hold seats in the House by right of rank. The balance of the membership, comprising only a very small percentage of the total, is elective, but is chosen solely by and from among the wealthy classes. The rank and file of the voters have nothing whatever to say about who shall sit in the House of Peers.

There is a widespread demand throughout the country that seats in the House of Peers shall be awarded by popular vote. The proposal is to permit members of the Imperial family to continue to hold seats by inherited right.

House of Peers is being led by the Seiyukai party, more or less actively supported by the Kakushin Club. Leaders of these organizations are demanding that Premier Kato submit to the Diet a bill for the reorganization of the House of Peers.

Strong pressure is also being brought to bear upon Premier Kato by members of the House of Peers and others of the nobility against any reform of the Upper House. The Peers show every indication of intention to fight for maintenance of the present system regardless of the admitted trend of public sentiment.

Unless Premier Kato brings in a reform bill, however, it is regarded as probable that the Seiyukai party will withdraw.
