## NATURALIZATION WILL GET FORTUNE

LONDON, Jan. 21. — If Dr. Max Waechter, of Berlin, renounces German citizenship and becomes a naturalized British subject, eventually he will receive an inheritance of \$1,500,000.

That's the curious provision inserted in the will of Sir Max Leonard Waechter, a London and Liverpool merchant and uncle of the German doctor, who died recently. Sir Max's widow will have the use of his fortune of \$3,000,000 during her lifetime, after which it will be split, one half going to Sir Max's son, the other half to the nephew, "provided that, within five years of the death of the

## testator's widow he shall give notice of his intention to leave Germany and establish himself in the British Empire and become a naturalized British subject."

If Dr. Waechter and his children refuse to comply with the terms of the will the fortune will be distributed to various charities. Sir Max was himself a native German, but became a naturalized British subject in 1885 and was knighted in 1902.
