RADIO CAN PRINT WITHOUT PRINTING BY FRENCH DEVICE

PARIS, Jan. 22.—Three houses out of every hundred in France have a radio receiving set, which means that there are more than a million in the entire country. The number of radio owners has been growing to such an extent during the last few years that the government has become alarmed. The Minister of the Interior and the Director of the Surete Generale are now working to establish regulations and a service that will keep tabs on the operations of all wireless owners.

An effective surveillance over all radio stations, large or small, receiving or sending, is needed for the good of the public as well as that of the country. The new invention of the radiogram by Dr. Fournier d'Albe now assures the photography of radio sounds. The apparatus itself is very simple, consisting of resonators, each one a glass or metallic tube closed at one end and

open at the other. At the open end is a little "tongue" of mica, very thin, to which is attached a mirror. The tongue and the tube are attuned to the same note and will respond to no other, no matter how strong the emission. Thus when a piece of music is played and transmitted by radio, each resonator embraces its own note and reproduces it. The response is exceedingly rapid and stops immediately after the termination of the note. Naturally the notes are longer and more marked when they are strong. Speeches may be recorded in the same manner. If all notes could thus be registered stenography would become a superfluous science and books would be printed without ever having been printed.
