**JEWEL REBUILDING PALESTINE — THE REASON**

The Prospect of Jerusalem Becoming the Capital of the World

Many have wondered why so numerous a people as the Jews do not have a nation of their own, especially when 3,000 years ago they were the most prominent people upon the earth. The greatest and most wonderful and mysterious book on earth is the Bible, which is confessedly a Jewish production, inspired by the great Creator.
