GEORGIA SWEPT BY FLOOD AND

Five Counties Are Covered by Raging Waters From Heavy Rain Storms

IS DAMAGED TO \$100,000 #

Chicago Recovering From Effects of Near Blizzard Which Covered Streets With Snow

ATLANTA, Jan. 27. - Southern Georgia, the most productive section of the state is today suffering from one of the worst floods in the history of that section. Five counties, the cream of the agricultural section of this farming state were practically burried beneath acres of roaring water which is being emptied toward the gulf of Mexico after three days of torrential rains in the northern part of the state

Scores of cattle and other live stock have been drowned. Acres of land has been washed over and light buildings carried away in the tremendous rush of water. It is estimated that the damage will reach several hundred thousand dollars, even should the conditions become no worse within the next twenty four hours.

Newton, the county seat o Baker county, a week ago a thriving little city, is today inundated. Not one of the town's four hundred residents are left in th phone poles. Almost the entire city has been ruined, wiped off the map by the raging waters.

It is not definitely known how many lives have been lost in the floods, since no means of checking those missing is possible as yet. It is known however that large number of the residents of Newton were carried away by the flood waters, among them at least twenty women and children. Two effects were caught by the raging waters and have not as yet

been heard from. Thousands of acres of the most productive land in the South have been entirely covered with water, ranging from a foot to five feet in depth. Crops have been ruined, obtain money with which to finance their future operations.
