America's Income Goes to the Wage Earners

DETROIT, Mich., Jan. 27.—Three-fourths of America's annual income goes to wage earners, according to A. W. Frye, supreme commander of the Maccabees, in an address here.

"Between 1919 and 1924 the United States produced an income of \$321,000,000,000, an economist recently figured," said Mr. Frye. "Of this total \$240,000,000,000 went to workers. The year 1920 was the peak period in national income, the total reaching \$72,000,000,000. In 1921 it was \$55,000,000,000. In 1922 it amounted to \$60,000,000,000, and in 1923 it reached \$71,000,000,000."

WHITEHALL, Jan. 27.—Whitehall's new gravity water supply system was put in operation recently and furnishes the city with an unlimited supply of water from the Adirondacks.
