### SOME DIFFERENCE

European telephone experts met at Paris some weeks ago to discuss the establishment of an international advisory committee on long-distance telephony in Europe.

From a technical standpoint there is no reason why long-distance telephone communication should not be made as easy and universal in Europe as it is in North America; but the financial and political difficulties of co-ordinating the telephone systems of a dozen different countries are considerable.

We should never become entirely "satisfied" when it comes to civic and commercial growth.

Though the phrase borders close to the hackneyed, we are urged to repeat that "what town has done, town can do!"

### A BUGABOO

Now they tell us that the Child Labor amendment is socialism. The country doesn't fear socialism any more. It knows that there is no such thing as an organized socialist party. Socialism means so many things to so many different people that there is no way of defining it. Whatever we don't like is socialism, and whatever we do like it statesmanship. Any time we want to argue against anything and can't think of anything else to say, we say it is socialistic.

Unquestionably, the tendency of the times is to be helpful, and if this be socialism, then the country is quite generally socialistic.
