Cutting Timber Aids in Growth Claims Expert

MISSOULA, Mont. Feb. 3. — Recent studies by I. T. Haig of the Priest River Forest Experi- ment Station show that the growth of the western white pine trees left standing after logging is ac- celerated as the result of such liber- ation. On several older timber sales in the Couer d'Alene Nat- ional Forest, in northern Idaho, this increased growth was found, and was noted to be greater in the small trees than in the larger ones. Where trees were slightly lacking in health and vigor, how- ever, there was less response.

Throughout, Mr. Haig found that the response was less aggressive than that of western yellow pine. Acceleration in western white pine evidently begins two years after cutting and continues at least as long as 15 years, the age of the oldest cut-over area stud- ied.

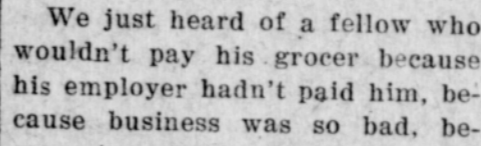
