

for some time in teaching languages and, also to some extent in teaching telegraph code; but Captain Ferriter has improved the method with excellent results.

It has long been a recognized fact that in learning the code the student is handicapped if he associates the idea of dots and dashes with letters of the alphabet instead of only the sound of the dots and dashes. For this reason messenger boys who grow up in telegraph offices usually make the best and fastest operators, as they learn the sound of the letters rather than the characters which stand for the letters.

At Camp Vail the new system is for a first-class operator to send letters and numerals, which are recorded directly upon a wax phonograph record. These records are then used on a phonograph, so that the student hears the sounds representing letters always correctly sent, and at such a speed and for such a length of time as

The student is always taught to receive letters before he attempts o send. After once learning to receive correctly by the sound of the letters it is a very simple matter for him to send, and speed is only a matter of practive.


