West Canada Gets Huge Paper Mills WINNIPEG, Man., Feb. 16 - Erection of the first pulp and paper mill in Western Canada in 1925, at a cost of \$5,000,000 has been assured by the purchase announced here of 3,000,000 cords of standing pulpwood, in Northern Manitoba, from the Dominion Government by the J. D. McArthur interests of Winnipeg. The McArthur interests will pay the Canadian Government \$2.80 per cord for the pulpwood, or a total of \$8,400,000. The mill, it is expected will be erected at St. Boniface, across the river from Winnipeg. It will have a daily capacity of 500 tons.

Dumbness may arise in the case of little children through progressive deafness. In the case of adults apoplexy may lead to a temporary loss of speech. But dumbness being in very many cases an outward symptom of grave constitutional disturbance, its cause should be sought in the general physical condition. Recent researches have shown that there is a definite connection between dumbness, as the result of accidents, and right and left-handedness. As we know, there are two speech centers, one in either hemisphere of the brain; yet only one of these centers is ever utilized - the left brain-center in right-handed persons, and the right brain-center in left-handed persons. It has been thought that the early development of one hand or side (usually the right) has developed the other hemisphere only; hence the other hemisphere is dormant and inactive. At all events, it has been proved that injury to one hemisphere renders a person completely dumb; though the same center on the opposite side of the brain is perfect. From this fact, Dr. Hanna Thomson and other brain specialists have drawn the conclusion that only half of our brain is ever used; the other half being held "in reserve," as it were, in case of accident.

The practical deduction to be drawn from this is that all children should be trained from earliest infancy to be ambidextrous. If the right and left hands are used alike as they should be, this one-sided development is avoided; and it has been shown that, in such cases, injury to one speech center does not cause the work of the other center to be done. Even in cases where dumbness has resulted in this way, the patient, if not too old, has been taught to speak again by making him use his left hand for everything - that is, making him left-handed and so right-brained. These are very significant facts, and should be kept in mind in treating all cases of this character.

Where this unpleasant defect is brought about by constitutional causes, very often it can be materially or wholly remedied by a general increase in vitality. I would suggest to selection of the vitality-building regimen adapted to the strength of the patient.

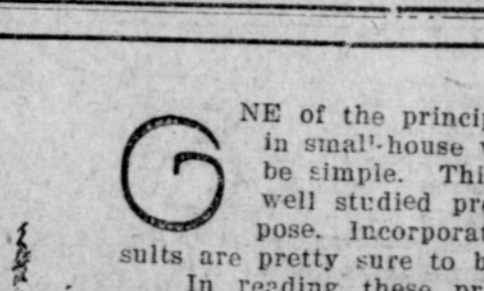
ONE of the principles of design to be observed in simple house work is that the design should be simple. This means plain, pleasing lines; well studied proportions; symmetry; and repose. Incorporate these principles, and the results are pretty sure to be pleasing. In reading these principles have been observed. The plain roof, the narrow-gable cornice; the triple sash at either side of the entrance; and the porch-roof featuring that give this home the charm it has. The plan itself, though the house is only 29x28.6, is so well arranged that little, if any, room is left for improvement. The house contains three rooms: living room, bedroom and kitchen. In addition, there are a generous-sized bath and a service-hall. A kitchen-porch keeps rain and snow from the kitchen door and steps. The kitchen itself is especially well arranged for easy work, there being ample room for the dining-table at the front under the window. On special occasions the dining-table could be placed in the living room. There are good wall-space and linen and clothes-closets. A back-stair leads to the attic, which could be used for storage. A half-basement provides room for fuel and vegetables.
