## CONGRESS VOTES TO RAISE OWN SALARIES

WASHINGTON, Feb. 20.—By a vote of 237 to 93, the house today passed the senate bill under which the salaries of the members of the house and senate will be raised from \$7,500 per year to \$16,000.

The measure also provides for increases for the cabinet members, the speaker of the house and the vice president, from \$12,500 to \$15,000. It is reported that President Coolidge is preparing to veto the bill. Opponents of the measure described it as a "grab bill."

T. C. Jacks of San Francisco, ticket seller for the California Transportation company, testified that a day or two before the fatality, Page told him "I guess I will drive the Chrysler up north, and surprise the wife."

The testimony of Mrs. Page and Jacks was taken Wednesday to expedite the hearing, and so they could return to San Francisco at once. Further evidence in the case will be presented at the term of the petit jury next week.

The state was represented by Assistant District Attorney Moulton, and the claimant by Attorney George M. Roberts.
