GOODING BILL DROPPED

In the House the Commerce Committee of Congress dropped the Gooding bill by a vote of 11 to 6. It was a February 5th, 1925. bill affecting the long and short haul provisions of the Transportation act.

Commercial organizations and business interests of the Pacific Coast and majority of the Interstate Commerce Commission strongly opposed the bill. It would have given steamship interests a monopoly and possible rate increases.

The present Transportation act empowers the Interstate Commerce Commission, where the facts of the case justify, to grant a transcontinental line authority to charge less for a longer than a shorter haul over the same line, this being done in instances to enable the carriers to load cars they would otherwise haul empty.

This phase of the law was sought to be repealed by the Gooding act, and it was the opinion of Pacific Coast commercial and business interests that the public welfare would be best served by the law as it stands.
