According to Washington despatches, Frank B. Kellogg, who becomes Secretary of State on March 4, is sounding foreign nations as to their participation in a new arms reduction conference. Benito Mussolini, Fascist Premier of Italy, is rapidly recovering from a recent attack of illness. Gloria Swanson, American motion picture actress, who recently married the Marquis de la Falaise de la Courdraye in Paris, was operated on there on the day she was to have sailed for America. Mrs. Julius Kahn, widow of the San Francisco Congressman, who died recently, has been named in a special election to fill his seat.

## GERMANY'S PRESIDENT DIES AFTER ILLNESS

BERLIN, Feb. 28.—Frederich Ebert, first president of the German republic died early today, after four days struggle with peritonitis following an operation for appendicitis. Ebert died at the very zenith of his career. He was the man who led his nation through the trying post-war days, and its terrific struggles, famine and financial troubles. His term of office was to have expired next June 30. He was the son of a harness maker and had no more than common school education. Chancellor Luther will act as president until the election is over.

## CONSTRUCTION ON NEW HOTEL IS GOOD

(Continued from Page One)

cemented. This process is done very systematically, and has been progressing at the rate of a floor a week for the last three or four weeks.

A wooden elevator is situated in front of the building, right of tower section, and run by cables connected with a machine on the ground. At the bottom, the cement is mixed in a big concrete machine. It is then wheeled in barrows to the conveyor, where it is placed on the platform. A worker at the top control the lever, and as a full load goes up, an empty one comes down on a twin conveyor. As the full barrow rises level with the top it is stopped and wheeled by the leverman along a walk and dumped in the form. In the meantime another worker has come up and repeated the operation, causing an almost steady flow of concrete into the forms. After this is done another floor is started, and by the time the last one is dry, pouring is ready on the next.

Plumbing and lighting fixtures have been finished in tune with the rest, and is now a little in advance. Plumbing is under the supervision of Bill Blumming.

At the right hand back side, a large iron pipe is being put in, which leads to the furnaces in the basement.

The speed with which construction has been going on, is almost an indication of the inconceivable a sample of unusual contracting ability. Back of it all, however, there is a guiding hand. Just who this is, is not exactly known. However, it is believed to be Bert Thomas, the amicable foreman. Thomas has been in charge of operations since the structure first left the ground, and to all general appearances he knows the game of building. The company has been allowed a month, overtime in case of delays caused by weather, but now has an aspect of completion as much before.
