**PET OF HOSPITAL, BURNED, IS CURED**

**PHILADELPHIA**—Donald Rose, 5, will soon leave the St. Agnes Hospital, for his home at Kane, Pa., and his place will be hard to fill among the doctors, nurses and attaches of the hospital.  
 "Donnie" was brought to St. Agnes a year ago, after he was burned about the face and body while playing in the kitchen of his home. The lad was unable to raise his head from his chest. He was unable to open his hands or close his eyes, physicians said. Donald's parents are poor. An up-State physician heard of the boy's plight and wrote to surgeons at the St. Agnes Hospital, explaining that the boy's condition demanded quick treatments. The boy was sent for immediately.  
 The twelve operations which he has undergone to replace the burned tissues have not dimmed "Donnie's" sunny disposition, which has won the admiration of the doctors, nurses and others at the hospital. Donald is unable to smile or laugh yet, he tries. Surgeons promise that after the next operation, which is scheduled for September the boy will be able to smile as well as the other children who visit him daily.  
 The surgeons believe that by the time Donald is 15 every scar and line on his face will have disappeared.  
 "Donnie" will soon be able to return to his parents, who have seen him only once since he left home.

**TAX REDUCTION PLANS OUTLINED**  
 WASHINGTON, Sept. 10—(U. P.)—The repeal of the publicity clause in the present revenue act will be recommended by the Treasury Department when the house ways and means committee meets on October 15, to receive an outline of the tax reforms desired by the administration, it was learned unofficially today.

Among other suggestions to be submitted in the department's outline to the committee which will be drafting a new revenue law are:  
 1. Tax exempt securities are to be eliminated.  
 2. Surtaxes to be reduced.  
 3. Inheritance taxes be eliminated and estate taxes reduced.

OTTAWA—Heroic statue of the Prince of Wales, made of butter, is an outstanding attraction of the Canadian exhibit at Memley. More than three and one-half tons of the best Canadian butter were used in the representation of the Prince and his riding horse in front of his ranch house at High River, Alberta.

The Prince, hatless, is represented as standing beside the horse and looking out over the heads of the spectators as if surveying the Canadian landscape. The statue is pronounced an excellent likeness. Details of the prince's riding suit and the saddle and bridle are accurately reproduced in the yellow medium. Behind him is represented the front of the ranch house and a corner of the orchard.

**Anti-Friction Suit Lets Divers Down 500 Feet**

LONDON—An anti-friction diving suit for use under the sea at a depth of 500 feet has been invented by Sir Frederick Young. Hitherto it has been possible to get divers down to deep levels of the ocean, but owing to the terrific pressure below the depth of 200 feet they have been unable to move their limbs and were therefore helpless.

The new invention may make it possible to work freely at a depth of 500 feet. It may make possible the working of virgin pearl fisheries. Attempts may be made by the use of the new suit, to salvage the Egypt, which lies off Ushant and contains \$5,000,000 worth of gold and silver. Heretofore salvage work on this vessel has been impossible.
