MOSCOW—Iodine at one-third the world's market price, and in quantities sufficient to supply one-half the world's needs will be produced in a new plant nearing completion in Baku. The capacity of the plant will be 350 to 400 tons yearly, whereas the present world's output is 700 tons. After meeting the domestic demand for 100 tons, there will remain 250 to 300 tons for export.

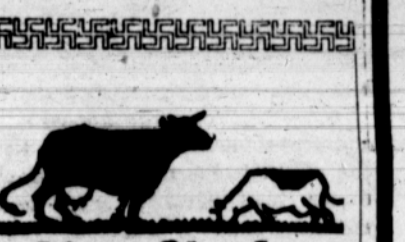
