NO VALUE IN CONGRESSIONAL HEARINGS!

President Coolidge has shown such a facility for un-tangling knots in American public policy that there is observed a general willingness to anticipate that his action in the aircraft situation will lead to universal light. He has a pacifying hand, that nearly always leads to constructive action.

But of all the suggestions that have been made, the one that does not appeal to us at all is that of a congressional investigation. Senator Couzens of Michigan gets in the news with this suggestion. We do not imagine that Congress itself will take to the idea. Congressmen rarely do, except those who find some personal advantage in being in on the hearing or the junket.

Can anyone point out, in the past, any great or use ful truth or any constructive policy that has been evolved out of such a hearing? Some of them for a time have seemed to make reputations. Finally, they have destroythem. In the oil scandal, for instance, Senator Wheel er of Montana is as dead as is Attorney General Dougherty. And the hearings themselves do not, unfortunately. give a status to evidence. They are conducted in such a loose manner, that they serve political purposes only.

The people of the United States have a high respect for men who speak up for what they know, even if there are differences of opinion as to the policies proposed. But the American people have little patience with the rehashing of complaints, such as are dealt with at congressional

A total saving of nearly a third in the principal ite of freight traffic costs has been effected by the railroads since the period of federal control

During the war, the primary requisite was delivery cost was a secondary consideration. Wages were raised equipment costs went up, taxes increased. Further restrict tions were added by the Transportation Act of 1920 and most roads when turned back to their private owners were losing money.

Under such circumstances, investers were lacking and the railroads set about recovering lost ground by economics and operating efficiency. The progress they have made since 1920 along these lines looms as one of the most important and instructive chapters in transportation history.

Freight charges were reduced during the period of 1921 to 1924 to an extent that saved shippers \$1,161,000,-690 of the amount they would have had to spend had the 1921 freight rates remained in operation.


