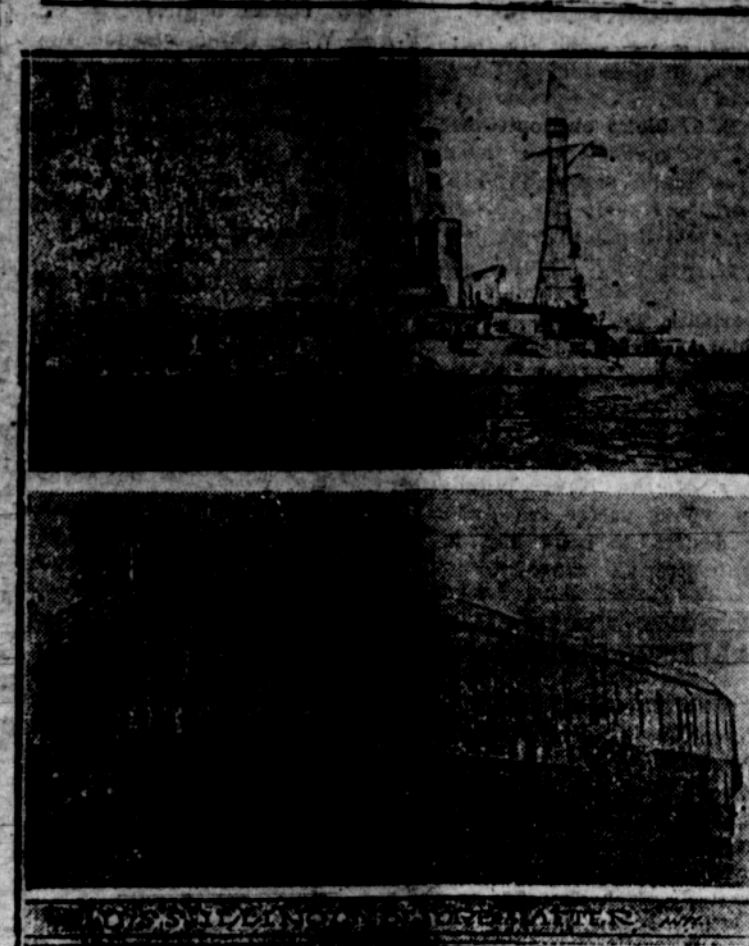

**PARIS**—Parisian artists and lovers of beautiful things are alarmed over the repairs now being made at the Grand Trianon Palace of Versailles, the former treasure house of Madame de Maintenon.

The lovely pink marble columns which time and weather had mellowed into the softest rose tint began to show large cracks some time ago. The repair men got busy and, as unfortunately is often the case, began to restore and not to beautify. They scraped and scratched the lovely marble, filled up the cracks with red clay and finally gave a glaring red coat of varnish to it all. The result is sausages and the charming Palace of the Thousand and One Nights much like the front of a Parisian butcher shop.

**13th Century Mosaic Unearthed at Vatican**

**ROME**—Monsignor Caselli, director of St. Peter's Museum, has unearthed in the underground vaults of St. Peter's basilica an original unrestored mosaic by the thirteenth century artist Giotti, representing the head of an angel.
