## SIX DESPERADOES BREAK SEATTLE JAIL

SEATTLE, Sept. 15. — (U. P.)—Six desperadoes, making a wild dash through the King county jail here today, escaped, and were being trailed this afternoon through the city by all available deputies, detectives and patrolmen. The men who took part in the sensational escape, all of whom are known as "desperate" characters, are Floyd Richardson, Ed Watson, Joe Ward, Alvah Kilbourne, B. H. Johnson and James Burns, alias Jim Gambertino.

## Too Many Laws Says French Paper

PARIS—"In the United States a new law is made almost as often as a baby is born," says the French financial newspaper Les Nouvelles, commenting on the unnecessary law making craze of American Congress. "The poor old American eagle is helplessly trussed up with, rounds and rounds of legal red tape."

"A man is elected to office in the United States not to enforce the laws but to manufacture them. The more he manufactures, the greater his success as a legislator. Who would ever think the modern Americans are the descendants of discontented Europeans, who, oppressed by laws, fled to a virgin country to breathe the atmosphere of freedom."

"These days the liberty lovers again cross the ocean but in the opposite direction. Our American guests seek 'in France what they cannot find at home, they endeavor to escape from the restrictions they encounter in America. After all, what are laws? A great race has lived happily with only ten and has certainly prospered since Sinai."

## RODGERS MUST TAKE UP BUREAU JOB

WASHINGTON, Sept. 15. — (U. P.)—Commander John Rodgers and his crew of the FN-9-1, will arrive in San Francisco aboard the U. S. S. Idaho on September 24, and will spend a week there, while the Idaho enters drydock, the navy department was advised in a special dispatch from Admiral S. Robinson, commander in chief of the battle fleet.

The fliers will then go to San Diego, and Rodgers will come on to Washington to assume the duties as assistant chief of the bureau of aeronautics. Although Rodgers advised Secretary of the Navy Wilbur that he would prefer sea duty, Wilbur desires to have him in an administrative capacity.

DEL MONTE, Calif., Sept. 15. — (U. P.)—The invading star, H. Chandler Egan, of Medford, Oregon, was off today on the second day of the California amateur golf championships here on even terms with George Von Elm, of Los Angeles. ## S. P. WINS CASE OVER LAND GRANT

PORTLAND, Sept. 15. — (U. P.)—A judgment of \$4,077.478.35 was given the Southern Pacific railroad yesterday in the federal court here, in payment of an Oregon and California land grant case.

The Southern Pacific company, which absorbed the Oregon and California railways years ago, asked some eight million dollars in settlement of the case, which has been in the federal courts for more than a decade. The government conceded about \$12,000 to the claim, litigation which arose over the payment to be made to the railroad for the return of land to the government.
