Educators are already at the task. They seized the situation and for some time in conference groups the subject of character development and citizenship training has received their attention.

It is a defense program of no mean proportions and worthy the aggressive support of our better citizenry.

MITCHELL HASTY IN GRABBING EVIDENCE

It is interesting to note that while skilled airmen in both the army and the navy departments of the United States service are warm as ever in their insistence that the "air" should be given special attention by the American government, they are controvcrting, one at a time, the pieces of evidence that Colonel Mitchell is bringing to support his views.

It appears that Mitchell is going utterly wild in his attempt to support what may be an entirely correct position.

Whether there should be a separate air "department" is partly a matter of service, partly of administration, and partly of expense. No single answer can be given by the government — it must be given with a consideration of all these factors.

Of course there could be no quibbling about expense, for instance, if the present administration were destroying lives.

But Colonel Mitchell's attempts to tie up the loss of life with the manner of administration of the department seems entirely to have failed. There has been no difference in opinion between the "air men" and the "ground men" that has caused loss of life.

True, the air men do not like the ground men. They are jealous of certain promotions and the consequent honors and emoluments of the ground men. Perhaps these matters should be corrected. But the correction is not hastened, but is if anything delayed by sensational charges that loss of life, or of property or even of department efficiency, has been due to the air vs. ground distinction.

TWO CHAMPIONS CHANGE SPORTS

NEW YORK—One of the strangest quirks in this corrugated business of sport is the "hoss-and-hoss" trade of activities indulged in by the two great champions of other days—Maurice McLaughlin and Cyril Tolley. The former, almost ten years away from the tennis courts, has turned to golf and is said to be shooting somewhere in the middle seventies. The latter has made his turn-over a patriotic issue. He has turned from golf to tennis in the hope of giving England's Davis Cup teams something beyond a representative who can shake hands gracefully after the match.

Tolley means to concede two years of his athletic life, to this ambition. A tremendous driver on the links, he wants to apply this power to tennis, which he played with some little success before taking up golf. His failure seems almost inevitable.

A heavy man and inclined to be a bit ponderous in his movements, he can hardly expect to step around with the human gazelles that play tennis nowadays. Furthermore, the muscles Tolley developed as a golfer will not be those he will attempt to use in tennis.

Altogether, it would seem that a sixteen-year-old who never handled a racquet is a better prospect than the retired golfer, who reached and passed his best five years ago.

McLaughlin has been out of competitive sport for almost twice that length of time, yet his prospects are to be preferred over those of Tolley. The Comet burned himself out of the courts with his dynamic methods of attack, but a golfer needs no speed. He needs hitting co-ordination, coolness and concentration.

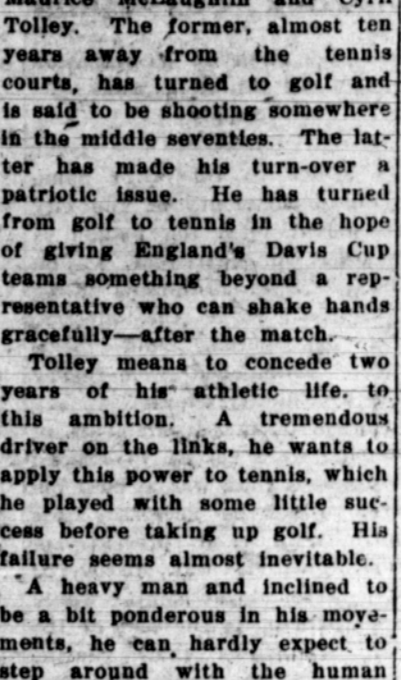
McLaughlin has all of those in a marked degree or did have them when he was playing tennis. They were what made him a great competitor and, if he

goes in for tournament golf, as advice from the Coast would indicate, there is every likelihood of McLaughlin proving himself a good match player, even if his medal scores are not of the best.

He has as a precedent the record of Miss Mary Browne, fellow Californian, who last year reached the semi-finals of the women's tennis championship and the finals of the golf title event with a space of months.

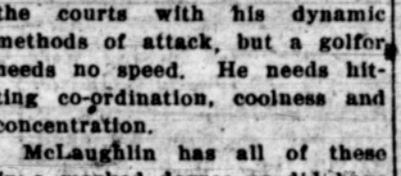
