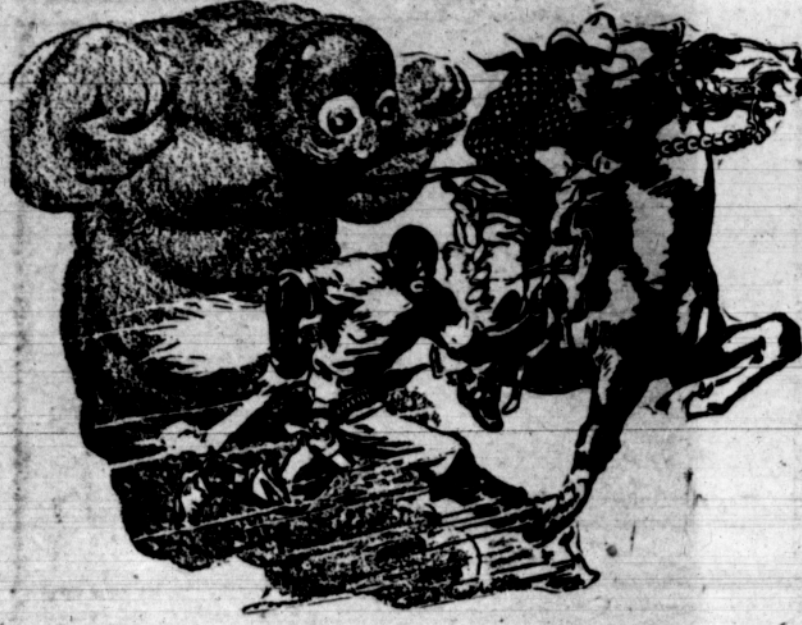

Klamath Indian, Stabbed in Heart, Expected to Live

KLAMATH FALLS, Ore., Sept. 18.—(U. P.)—Although Monroe Faithful, Indian, had his heart pierced by a dagger, he is still living today, and physicians believed he would survive. The Indian was knifed, the authorities say, by a Klamath Indian rancher, Williams Eggman. Attendents at the local hospital said that although the dagger penetrated his heart, no important arteries were severed. The stabbing occurred yesterday, when Faithful appeared on the Eggman ranch to claim cattle he said were his. Eggman is being sought by the authorities.

## Heaviest Rain of Season Amounts to One Inch Here

The heavy rainfall, which started with a light drizzle Wednesday morning, then broke into a heavy downpour about four o'clock Wednesday afternoon, and continued to pour throughout the night, amounted to exactly one inch, according to Weather Observer Louis Dodge.

This is the heaviest rain experienced here since last winter, and according to Dodge, is the forerunner of the winter season in Southern Oregon. Tomatoes, melons, grapes and practically all soft fruits and vegetables suffered as a result of Wednesday night's rain. The grape crop, said to be one of the heaviest in years, was damaged to some extent, the water causing the riper grapes to crack and the larger bunches to mildew.

The Judge Advocate General's office at the war department was drawing up formal charges of insubordination against Mitchell, for a court martial in Washington in about two weeks.

Chairman Dwight W. Morrow of New York, an intimate friend of President Coolidge, told his fellow members of the special board, that economy would be necessary, since there are no congressional appropriations for the probe. The board has definitely decided to call witnesses from the navy, war and postoffice departments first, and Mitchell and other critics later, it was announced.
