CHINA CULTURE IS ASSEMBLED IN CYCLOPEDIA

PEKING, Sept. 25—(U. P.)—Modern motor trucks have been conveying priceless ancient volumes to a special railroad car here as the last chapter of a process of restoring to authenticity at Mukden, Manchuria, a set of books striking deep into the culture of China.

This set is known as the *Ssu Ku Chuan Shu*, or the Chinese Encyclopedia. Only four such sets were made. Each set consists of 6,184 covers of Chinese style, each cover containing six to eight separate volumes so that the whole encyclopedia consists of about 50,000 volumes. The subjects dealt with are the Classics, History, Prose and Poetry, and these subjects are covered as fully as information went up to the time of the Emperor Chia Lung (1735-1799 A. D.), who ordered compilation of the work.

One of the four sets was destined for Chekiang, one for the old capital of Jehol, one for Peking and one for Feng-tien province of which Mukden is the capital. The Mukden set had strayed, as in the way of valuable things in disordered China, but after prolonged negotiation it was decided to assemble the books, inventory them and send them home once more. They will be carefully housed in the Wen Hsieh library at Mukden, by order of the "Mukden Warlord" Feng Yu-hsiang.

Some idea of the scope of the set may be gleaned by the fact that when a Shanghai firm negotiated last year with a view to copying the encyclopedia, it was found the work would require ten years and cost several million dollars.
