THE WARRIOR OF STORMS

LAKEHURST, Sept. 23 — (U. P.) — Lieutenant Joseph B. 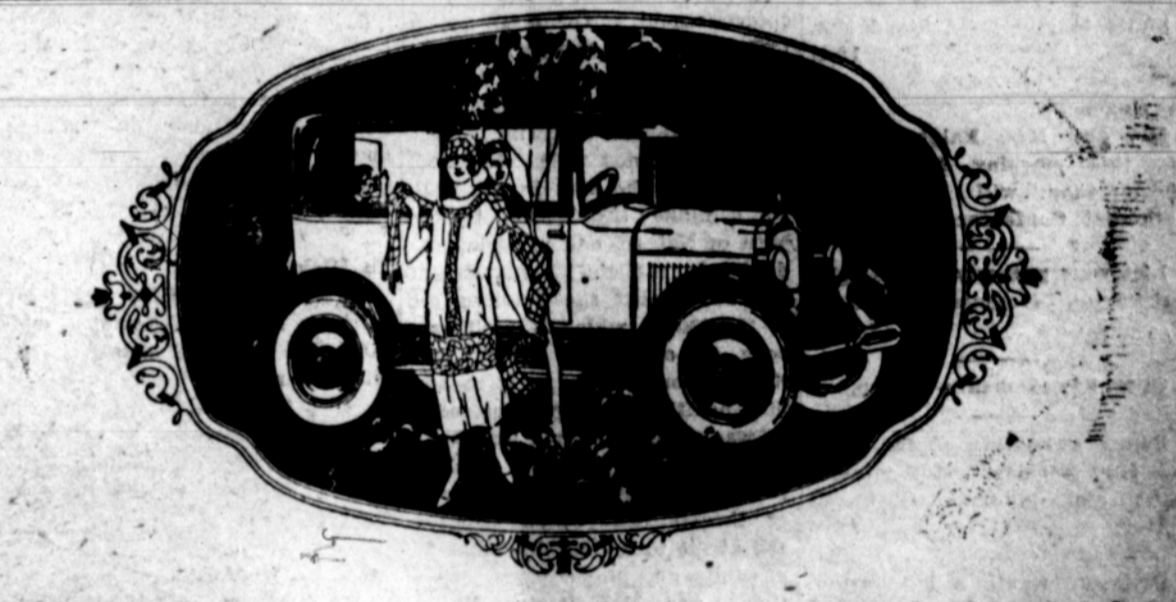
