TEAPOT-DOME NAVY MAN LOSES RANK

WASHINGTON, Sept. 30.—(U. P.)—J. K. Robison, chief of the bureau of engineering of the United States navy, who, with Edwin Denby, was the center of the naval participation in the Teapot Dome oil lease, has reverted from the rank of rear admiral to captain. The naval selection board failed to include Robison in its list of recommendations for promotion.

EXPERT SAYS AIRSHIP CREW INCOMPETENT

LAKEHURST, Sept. 30.—(U. P.)—Captain Anton Heiman, German dirigible expert, declared before the naval inquiry here today that he believed the Shenandoah was lost because of the inefficiency of the crew. When asked if he believed any of the crew were competent, Aerial Navigator Heiman said: "Oh, yes, as much as their limited experience would permit, but I've taken many an airship like the Shenandoah through winds that carried the ship up and down much faster than the Shenandoah was tossed around, and even through storms where snow flakes were so thick you couldn't see your fingers in front of your face."
