WASHINGTON—The Coolidges, you might say, must be incorrigible pay-walkers, considering all the stories the papers tell of their narrow escapes from being hit by automobiles.

Twice, just before he left Washington for Swampscott, the president had to jump like a kangaroo to dodge speeding cars.

Mrs. Coolidge barely missed being run down by one during the family's stay at the summer capital, and since their return here one of the presidential calls was so close that the driver responsible for it actually was arrested, which means there was no joke or exaggeration about it—the authorities were genuinely and thoroughly scared, and maybe the president was, too.

The truth is the Coolidges are no more reckless than any other pedestrians, but whereas the ordinary individual is endangered right along without attracting the least attention, when it happens to the president or his wife it creates a sensation.

They have a bodyguard with them also, to make an effective team.

For "cutting corners and failing to give way to a pedestrian," even when an arrest is made, the average bond required in Washington is about \$50, but when Nathan D. Smith did it, to the jeopardy of President Coolidge's life, he had to put up \$3500.

Probably Nathan will be more careful after this. He may never cross the presidential trail again, but he always will be afraid he will.
