It will take two weeks to credit the last minute payments made by mail. Employees of the tax department, some who have been at the post for eight years, said it was the heaviest rush they had ever experienced.

In addition to the 1924 taxes paid, \$2850.17 was paid of 1922 delinquent taxes, \$807 of 1922 delinquent taxes, and \$8.98 of 1921 delinquencies.

The delinquent taxes this year are less than in any year since 1910.

working in that capacity he contracted tuberculosis, but the disease did not develop until some time after his return to the United States.

When mustered out of the United States service, he was engaged by the Giants as a pitching coach, and in that capacity made a trip with the team in the spring of 1920. He was taken ill and after an examination was rushed to the tuberculosis camp at Saranac Lake.

Then began a bitter fight with the white plague, to which Mathewson had the aid of a devoted wife. The entire sporting world watched the battle which Christy fought with all the courage and lion-heart that had nerved him in hundreds of diamond battles and in the perils of the World War.


Mathewson won and returned to the national game as president of the Boston Braves, which office he assumed in 1923. Later the fatal disease came back, and finally claimed his life.
