The investigation, however, will tend to clarify the situation and may be of some value. It has at least developed one fact, namely, that both the army and navy did not receive the amount of money asked for when their appropriations were before congress. This resulted in curtailment of the naval air program.

Regardless of who may head any or all of the national defense departments, nothing constructive can be accomplished without the full co-operation of congress.


Everybody is looking for a short cut to wealth without work. Robbing a bank seems to be the most favored
