STEWART'S WASHINGTON LETTER

WASHINGTON—In two respects American statesmen show to a disadvantage in company with European public men. They're less mindful of sartorial correctness. They don't know languages. This was brought out very conspicuously at the recent gathering of the Inter-parliamentary Union here.
The American delegates dressed well enough. Their suits were brushed and pressed, and fit better than the Europeans'. Practically without exception they wore ordinary sacks, with soft felt hats and tan shoes, as often as not.
The Europeans, equally almost without exception, never appeared in anything less than the fullest "morning dress"—cutaway, pearl gray trousers, plug hat, patent leathers and spats, gloves, monocle in more than a few cases—the whole regalia.
With the women it was just the reverse. Many of the foreign delegates had their wiles with them.
For style they were nowhere, compared with their hostesses—at least, according to American ideas.
The Latins, among the visiting women, came the nearest to measuring up to the requirements of American tastes in dress, but even the gowns of these appeared to awaken no feelings of envy, so far as feminine Washington was concerned.

Why the old world outclasses America linguistically is easy to understand. Living at close quarters with other nationalities, the Europeans naturally learn one another's tongues.
The average American, surrounded only by his own kind, except along the Mexican border, where he does acquire a Spanish smattering, lacks the opportunity and incentive to learn languages, or to practice them even if he tries.

LOCUST WAR IN SOUTH SUCCESS, THOUSANDS DIE

MEXICO CITY, Oct. 14—(U. P.)—A report from the President of the National Junta for the campaign against the locust indicates that the fight to prevent the invasion of hitherto free areas is proving successful and that the areas now invaded with the pest should be free by the end of the year.
It is estimated that eighty per cent of the pest have been destroyed, totalling slightly in excess of two thousand tons of locusts, grass-hoppers and eggs. Efforts have been concentrated largely in destroying the new generation in the States where most damage has been done with a view to preventing invasion of the rich agricultural States on the Pacific coast and in the northwest, where for a time it was feared the locusts would spread.
If the campaign continues unabated, it is believed the stamp tax levied for the extermination of the pest, will shortly be abolished. It is too early to estimate the damage wrought but undoubtedly it will run into millions of pesos.
