Trotzky has entirely too much energy for the stabilized Soviet government. He was a pioneer in bumptious destruction. The Soviet is now seriously trying to work out a governmental plan for Russia. The leaders of the Soviet are growing conservative. They are trying to fulfil their obvious duty of governing the state. They find Trotzky a continuous interference. They never know, when they get up in the morning, what he has done the previous night.


