Mr. McCloskey is about 55 years old and has received a stipend and fellowship of living. When in New York and Los Angeles he always walks to and from his studio and spends as much time as possible in the open air. When he is at Siskiyou camp he enjoys going into the woods with the workmen and there getting and piling wood and digging out stumps.
