KEEP THE STREET CARS MOVING

"There has been altogether too much politics in the traction problem," says Lucius S. Storrs, Managing Director of the American Electric Railway Association.

"One of the gravest problems with which the industry has to cope is that of maintaining schedules in downtown streets. Where once this was a problem only in larger cities, now, on account of lack of proper ordinances and inefficient enforcement, it has become an issue in almost every city and town in the United States.

"Motor car owners and transportation companies have certain rights which should be granted by city officials, and once granted, protected. No one will seriously contend that an electric car should not have the right to way over its tracks at all hours of the day or night. No other vehicle has any right in such circumstances to hold it up. Officials of every city should recognize this right and enforce it."

Why should a banana peddler's wagon, a five-ton garbage truck or a gold plate limousine be allowed to block a street car track and delay hundreds or thousands of persons? If a policeman walked on the track and blocked traffic a policeman would remove him — why shouldn't a sane driver receive the same treatment?

COAL STRIKES FORCE GAS DEVELOPMENT

Announcement has been made of a new process for making heating and illuminating gas, which eliminates the poisonous carbon monoxide but produces twice the heating and lighting power of any gas now made for domestic use. The production cost is also said to be the lowest of any gas process known.

Such a discovery would be worth billions of dollars to the United States. It would be made to supersede the use of coal for heating and cooking and save the country from the periodical coal strikes that have so exasperated the nation.

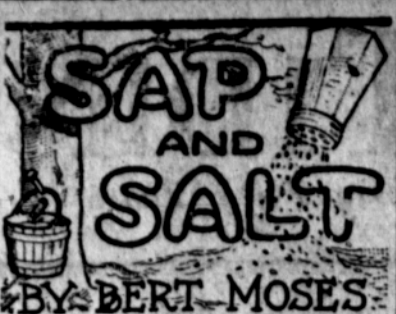

ENCOURAGE INVESTMENTS

INCREASE EMPLOYMENT

There are two ways to encourage investments in industrial undertakings. One is the abolition of the tax-exempt privilege on certain bonds and the equal taxation of all investments. The other is the reduction of taxes now so heavy that tax-exempt bonds seem the only way to invest a large income.

The important thing is to keep the nation's money at productive work, just as the nation's men and women and machinery of every kind should be at work. The result of equal taxation or tax reduction is that money flows into industry, thus making a market for labor and food and service of every kind.
