SOFIA, Oct. 23—(U. P.)—
The intervention by diplomats of the great powers with the Bulgarian government, has apparently halted the threat of war in the Balkans which has been clouding for the past four days, at least temporarily. As a result of the pressure from the powers, Bulgaria has voluntarily ordered her troops withdrawn from the frontier.
