## PROSECUTION SCORES IN EVOLUTION CASE

KNOXVILLE, Tenn., Oct. 24.—(AP)—The supreme court of Tennessee today upheld the plea filed by Attorney General Thompson to strike from the record of the Scopes evolution case the defendants bill of exceptions.  
Thompson contested the bill of exceptions on the grounds that it had been filed after the thirty days limit granted by Judge Ralston at Dayton. Dr. John R. Neal, Scopes' counsel had alleged in his answer that the court's order had been illegally changed to cut the limit down from 60 to 30 days.
